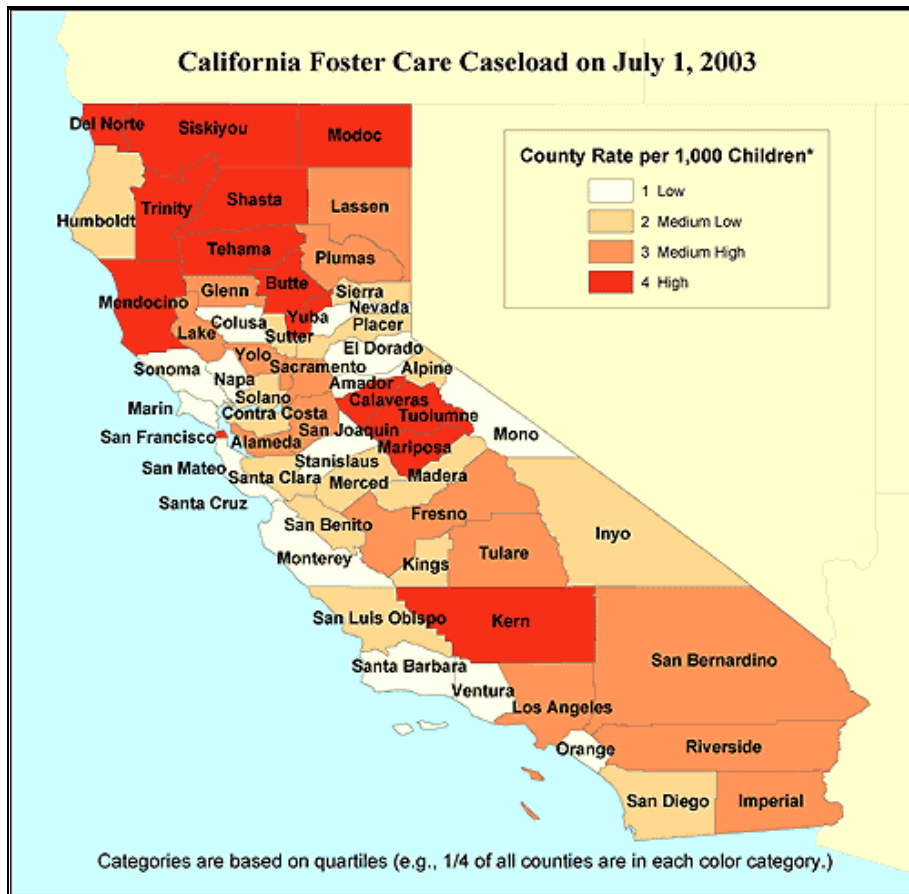


Map: Prevalence Rates
